Center of Excellence Hosts State FFA CDEs

The Arkansas FFA State Career Development Events (CDE) were held April 13-14, with the Poultry CDEs taking place on the 14th at the Center of Excellence for Poultry Science's Research Farm.

According to the Arkansas FFA website, career opportunities abound within today's agriculture industry and CDEs help students develop the abilities to think critically, communicate clearly and perform effectively in a competitive job market.

Arkansas FFA members have the opportunity to participate in 19 CDEs, ranging from floriculture to mechanics. Some events allow students to compete as individuals, while others allow them to compete in teams.

The state poultry CDE contest format consists of: live poultry, ready-to-cook poultry, shell eggs and further-processed poultry.

Lincoln High School was this year's winning team in poultry.




Lesleigh Beer (left), Poultry Science Outstanding Senior Student

Her undergraduate honors thesis was in the area of avian coccidiosis under the direction of Billy Hargis, where she was trained on laboratory techniques at Ohio State University and returned to Fayetteville to complete her thesis in the Poultry Health Laboratory.

Samantha is completing the requirements for her MS under the direction of Dr. Susan Watkins. In addition to her assistantship she has also received a graduate school scholarship from the poultry federation and has served as vice president of the Poultry Science Graduate Student Association.

Guru completed the requirements for his PhD this month under the direction of Dr. Wayne Kuenzel in neuroendocrinology.
